



PXF Studio Keybind Naming Guide

Auto Keybind filename rules for letters, numbers, and symbols

How it works: Name your SVG files using the rules below so Auto Keybind can assign them quickly and correctly. Auto Keybind uses filenames only - it does not read or recognize the artwork itself.

LETTERS

Uppercase

capital-<letter>-...

Example: capital-A-blue-drip.svg

Lowercase

lowercase-<letter>-...

Example: lowercase-a-blue-drip.svg

NUMBERS

Format: number-<digit>-... Example: number-7-blue-drip.svg

SYMBOLS

A symbol filename must begin with one of the accepted symbol names below.

QUICK TIPS

1	Matching is case-insensitive.
2	Anything after the recognized binding portion can be your own descriptive text.
3	Auto Keybind only binds confident filename matches. It does not guess.
4	If a filename does not match a rule, that glyph will be left for Manual Bind.
5	You can give this guide to your favorite chatbot and ask it to create a complete copy-paste filename list for your font.

FAST EXAMPLES

Artwork	Good filename	Auto Keybind result
Uppercase A	capital-A-blue-drip.svg	A
Lowercase a	lowercase-a-blue-drip.svg	a
Number 7	number-7-blue-drip.svg	7
Plus sign	plus-sign-bold.svg	+
Space	space-wide.svg	Space
